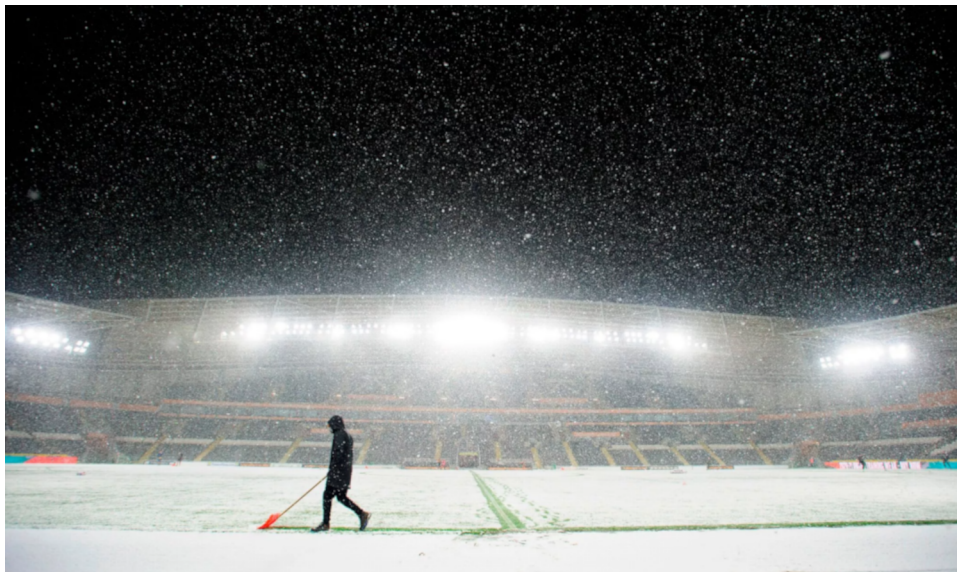

Ollie Harsley sums up the latest action for us.

As December began, Hull City made the worst possible start to their final month of 2025 against Middlesbrough at the MKM Stadium. They displayed some truly terrible defending in the first half to give four goals away and effectively hand Boro the points by half-time.

City improved somewhat in the second half and got a goal back through a Joe Gelhardt penalty, but it was really too little, too late. It was later revealed that Gelhardt suffered a calf injury and would be ruled out until the New Year which was obviously devastating news as he's been absolutely superb this season.

However, Sergej Jakirović's side soldiered on and put in a vastly better performance against Hollywood backed Wrexham a few days later. The Tigers completely dominated proceedings from start to finish and arguably put in their best and most complete display of the season thus far. Kyle Joseph put them ahead in the first half with his fourth goal of the campaign and the returning Oli McBurnie doubled the lead after the break by resuming his bromance with Ryan Giles.

Next up was a tricky looking away game against Millwall at the Den. After surviving an early onslaught by the hosts, City scored two goals in the first half through Joseph as he produced excellent finishes after being set up by Mohamed Belloumi and Liam Millar. The Lions were later reduced to ten men in the second half, but were able to grab a goal back before the Tigers sealed the win courtesy of a McBurnie header.

Just before Christmas, City hosted former Tiger Ryan Mason and his West Bromwich Albion side at the MKM. The club formally inducted both Tony Norman and Ken Houghton into the hall of fame before kick-off and they were both well deserved accomplishments.

The match itself was a very bitty affair and quite stop start throughout with no real rhythm of play for either team. There was a rather lengthy stoppage in the first half when Charlie Hughes took a blow to the head, but he was thankfully able to keep playing after receiving treatment. With a minimum of eight minutes added on before the break, the Tigers found a breakthrough as Oli McBurnie dispatched a penalty.

In the second half, West Brom were reduced to ten men when substitute Alfie Gilchrist received a straight red after a challenge on Liam Millar. Sergej Jakirović's men were able to see out the rest of the match to claim a victory that put them into fourth place for the Christmas Day table.
